### Draper ES Continuous School Improvement Plan (CSIP) & Land Trust Plan 2016-17

Draper ES CSIP for 2016-2017

**Litereacy Performance Goals:** 

By May 2017, 86% of our students K-5 will be proficient (80% or above) on both Literacy CBM and ELA Unit test data (with standardized administration).

Math Performance Goals:

By May 2017, 88% of our students K-5 will be proficient (80% or above) on both Math CBM and Math Topic test data (with standardized administration).

**PBIS Performance Goals:** 

By May 2017, we will decrease our ODRs from the classroom to less that 25% of all schoolwide ODRs. By May 2017, we will increase the number of our teachers scoring effective or above on Standard 1 to 75%.

2016 Midyear CBM data showed our school at 85%, end of the year data showed a slight decrease to 84% (90% was our CSIP goal).

There was a motion made by Jim Francis to amend our 2016-2017 CSIP goals from:

90% to 86% in ELA

90% to 88% in Math

Bilinda Wong seconded the motion.

### **Draper Elementary School Report Card & Data**

2014 Draper Elementary earned an A

2015 Draper Elementary earned an A

2016 June Draper Elementary earned an A

However, due to the Utah State Legislature and Utah Code 53(A)-1-1110, in September 2016 our grade was adjusted to a B.

Utah Code 53(A)-1-1110 states that if over 65% of the schools in Utah receive an A or B grade in 2016 the critera would be raised by 5%. Over 70% of Utah schools earned an A or B, hence 18 schools in our district were affected, Draper Elementary was one of those 18 schools.

## **Update on SCC 1:1 Technology Project**

With a high volume of teachers writing Donor's Choose grants, and the hard work of our community the technology 1:1 project is looking very good. As of September 2016 here is where we stand:

5<sup>th</sup> 1+:1 4<sup>th</sup> 1+:1 3<sup>rd</sup> 1:1.3 2<sup>nd</sup> 1:1.8 1<sup>st</sup> 1:4 K 1:3.3

The techonolgy resources that are earned by grant writing belong to the district. Teachers who leave Canyons District must leave the technology. Teachers who move within the district can take their devices with them, as long as they continue to be a classroom teacher.

# **Bus Efficiency Schedule Presentation**

Piper shared information regarding the possible Bell Schedule changes.

Reasons for the study-

There are Bus driver recruitment issues, the district is have a hard time recruiting and maintaining drivers. New schedule would give drivers more hours and longer routes which=better contracts. Also will help the district eliminate aging buses from the fleet, and bring more efficiency in District operations.

Summary of Findings-

Some data was removed (preschool, kindergarten, early out and late start routes), once removed 133 routes remained. Of these 133 routes, there were 13 regular educations single tier routes (1 bus/1 school/1 driver) and 11 single tier special needs routes. The main goal was to multi-tier as many buses as possible.

2 Options have been presented:

Option 1: Changes to most schools would be bell times 15 minutes either earlier or later than the current times, eliminating 21 buses from daily operation, saving about \$700,000 annually. Option 2: Changes to most school would be bell time up to 30 minutes either earlier or later that the current times, eliminating 33 buses from daily operation, saving about \$1,000,000 annually. As a SCC we discussed both options and agreed that Option 1 would have the least impact on our neighboring schools (Willow Springs and Corner Canyon High School), and we would hope that Option 1 would be supported by the district and Canyons School Board.
