1. Prior meeting minutes' approval Janene Day
March's Minutes were approved.
2. Review Budget for 2019-2020 School Year Christy Waddell
Christy has been told that we will be allowed more carry-over than normal. Although we will be paying aides through the year, so there will not be a huge amount.
