- b. Megan motioned to approve the minutes. Morgan seconded it. The minutes were unanimously approved by those present (Julie P., Melissa, & Ronnie were out of the room when minutes were approved).
- 3. Review Acadience Report Math
 - a. 2022-23 Draper Elementary Acadience Data.pdf
- 4. LAND Trust & TSSP
 - a. TSSP:Land Trust Goals 22-23.pdf
 - b. Reviewed the Math goals. We would like to increase by 8%. Mid-year assessments will be in January. They are doing progress monitoring in math. In math they look at computation (facts) and concepts and application (story problems, extended math sentences). Grades are tracking both.
 - i. Ronnie met with BLT and looked at the action plan summaries and how they were allocating money. The \$5000 for teacher packets this summer did not happen. Ronnie asked the BLT how are we spending the money moving forward? They decided there will be a ½ day sub for each grade level for the grade level to meet. In January the teams will meet for LA. In February the teams will meet for Math/Science. All substitute money will come out of TSSP. They would like to propose another 17 hour classroom aide to come in to help with progress monitoring to help with whatever the teachers need classroom wise.

- 1. Angie asked if they are having a hard time finding substitutes. Ronnie said they are able to get the majority of them and they are already asking for subs now for those days.
- ii. Ronnie said 8% increase is a lofty goal but thinks they can do it.
- iii. Morgan said last year that she knew many of the parents last year did not know that the third graders were supposed to memorize their multiplication facts. She asked that it is communicated explicitly with parents. Ronnie will talk with the 3rd grade team. Janene said she didn't know that the rewards offered were helping. Brooke said she doesn't remember it being stressed.
- iv. Brooke asked what the \$5000 for software is going towards. Ronnie said some is for Chinese software and some is for Mystery Science. Brooke said she had heard from teachers who had still wanted software for students to be able to use at home. Ronnie said the district has not approved Reflex because they think we should be addressing it in the classroom. We are seeing a shift away from technology and apps because we are not getting the biggest bang for our buck.
- v. Ronnie said USBE pulled Mandarin Matrix funding. Angie shared that the funding from Dual Immersion does not increase each year. Middle schools were having more proficiency needed so they shifted funding there. There is going to be a bill this year that will restore funding back which could bring some funding back. Ronnie said that the Chinese programs have the least resources. Janene said as an SCC it was brought up that in the past TSSP had paid for it and the SCC said no we would like to not fund it because it does not benefit the whole school. They are back in discussion to see if we can find a middle ground.
- vi. As far as Reflex and other apps it is VERY difficult to get apps/program approved.
 - 1. Melissa asked what is the hardest thing for teachers? Is it the grading?
 - 2. Ronnie said the data is not supporting the software. In Ronnie's opinion, it has been a drastic change coming off of COVID to have much less support.
 - 3. Melissa asked how we can help the teachers? Ronnie said that she has seen parents coming in to volunteer.
- vii. SCHOOL CLIMATE Ronnie would like to propose to not use the SRSS-IE data. Right now they have Mondays with Melissa that happens once a month and monthly themes. Ronnie would like to 3x a year have a survey asking what they have learned based on the skills addressed. The social workers are also doing a book once a month with each grade level.
 - 1. Angle asked, is the survey going to be identifiable? Ronnie said no.

- 2. Nancy asked if questions would be shared with parents beforehand? Ronnie said yes.
- 3. Megan asked if we would need to continue fund .5 FTE in order to have a full time social worker? Ronnie said yes. We currently have 1.5 social workers.
- viii. Nancy asked about keyboarding. What do they do on the elementary level? We have Typing club (district program). Right now, 3rd grade they practice for 15 minutes during the rotations. They are looking back at being brought nitro type. Julie P said it is in their curriculum map by grade. It starts in 2nd grade. Julie said in 5th grade they test typing. Nitro type is free and parents can access it at home.
- ix. Tawna asked if the recess aide was hired for play? Ronnie said no. She is unaware of a job ever being posted. Ronnie said they need some work at recess. We definitely have students that like to poke the bear and we're working on that. Students are not reading social cues. Ronnie does not see intentionally mean kids at our school.
- x. Ronnie will have everything written up for January and we will wordsmith it in January.
- xi. Jamie asked about bus behavior. Ronnie said she will be calling each bus down on Wednesday/Thursday to discuss bus behavior. Ronnie said she has more bus problems than anything.
