Meeting Minutes

- 1) Welcome: Alivia Farichild opened the meeting.
 - a) Attendance: Deanna & Elycia were absent. Angie attended via phone. All other council members were present in person.
- 2) Approve Previous Meeting Minutes:
 - a) **Alivia motioned to approve the minutes from last month.**
 - b) **Timette seconded the motion.**
 - c) **The minutes were unanimously approved.**
- 3) Chromebook Filtering Presentation and Discussion: Ronnie Mulqueen
 - a) SCC was asked to vote individually on Chromebook filtering options.
 - b) Principal Mulqueen presented the district's presentation on filtering options.
 - i) Option 1: No change; parents may request a "highly restrictive" setting for their child.
 - ii) Option 2: All elementary-level Chromebooks default to the "highly restrictive" setting. This would be the CSD standard.

- iii) Option 3: All elementary-level Chromebooks default to the “highly restrictive” setting, with parents able to opt into a less-restrictive setting for their child (reverse of current practice).
 - c) Definition of Highly restrictive:
 - i) Students *can't* search, create, or add images.
 - ii) Students *can* do word processing.
 - iii) Teachers must embed content.
 - iv) Canvas/Clever and all Canvas apps remain functional.
 - d) The council discussed an Alternative Proposal:
 - i) Option A: K–3 students remain under the "highly restrictive" setting, while parents of 4–5 grade students choose whether to maintain restrictions or allow transition.
 - ii) Option B: K–2 students remain under the "highly restrictive" setting, while 3–5 grade students transition unless parents opt for continued restrictions.
 - iii) Or following the same as above, switching the grades to K-2 and 3-5.
 - e) Principal Mulqueen clarified that technology is NOT used as a reward or free-time option.
 - f) Council Vote Results:
 - i) Option 1: 10 votes
 - ii) Option 2: 0 votes
 - iii) Option 3: 0 votes
- 4) Assistant Principal for 2025-2026: Ronnie Mulqueen
 - a) Draper Elementary will have an assistant principal for the 2025–2026 school year.
 - b) Rebecca “Becca” Bass has been appointed and is currently an assistant principal at Corner Canyon High School.
- 5) Discuss elections, open seats; especially if SCC holds a spring election: Ronnie Mulqueen
 - a) Returning Council Members (2025-2026): Alivia, Kaydee, Brian, Becky, Elycia.
 - b) Departing Council Members: Nancy, Angie, Timmette
 - c) Principal Mulqueen will reach out to Deanna to confirm her plans.
 - d) A reminder of open seats will be communicated to parents at the start of the school year.
- 6) Review current year’s LAND Trust plan, data and expenditures and review if on course or if amendments are necessary: Ronnie Mulqueen
 - a) The current year’s LAND Trust plan has been approved.
 - b) Funds are on track to be spent: the budget is projected to be within the 10% threshold to roll over for next year.
 - c) No amendments are needed at this time.
- 7) Review STEAM Night: Ronnie Mulqueen
 - a) Council members provided the following feedback.
 - i) Clay: One more bag needed.
 - ii) Stop motion videos: No popcorn next time.

- iii) Viewing arrangement: Three separate classrooms/screens for grades 3, 4, and 5.
- iv) Art display: Some projects were incomplete due to scheduling constraints.
- v) Kiabots: More track space needed to increase participation.
- vi) Overall: Strong attendance from both volunteers and participants.
